



*Launch of the Neighbourhood Plan Review*. Bishops Clyst Parish Council has decided that it is time to consider refreshing our Neighbourhood Plan. The current Plan has been in force since March 2017. A new Local Plan for East Devon is under preparation and the planning system is changing. Time is right to consider the relevance and role of the Bishops Clyst Neighbourhood Plan.

The Parish Council has commissioned a review of the policies in the current Plan, to ensure the Plan will continue to be relevant over the years ahead and influence local land use planning decisions in the best interests of the parish and its inhabitants.

Part of the review is a local assessment of the necessity for new development and its likely impact. Elsewhere in this edition of the Clyst Valley News is a 'Call for Sites' notice. We are asking local landowners if they have land they would like to put forward for development.

Importantly, everybody in the parish will be asked about the type and scale of development that is appropriate for our rural area. A community questionnaire will be available online and from Mills Stores, Sowton Church and the Cat and Fiddle Inn from 1st October 2021. Please look out for it and have your say.

## Clyst St Mary Flood Defence - Environment Agency Update October 2021



Works to install a new flood defence in the area have been challenging but we are happy to say that in the coming weeks we will be nearing completion of the scheme, providing defence to numerous properties within Clyst St Mary from the ever-growing threat of river flooding for many years to come.

In the coming weeks we will finish installation of our king post wall and installation of a stop log structure at the northern end of Frog Lane. From this point our construction team will begin pulling out of Clyst St Mary before returning with a small welfare unit to complete brief works

to install the stop logs on the mediaeval bridge. This will complete the flood defence scheme and works in the area.

We'd like to thank the people of Clyst St Mary for their patience and understanding during these works and are happy to be able to provide this new flood defence to further protect properties in the coming years.

#### Norman's Weather Report



August rainfall here at Ebford was very low at only 34 mm (1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> inches); thundery showers passed us by, and this total fell during the first and third weeks of the month. Of course, the last week, including the Bank Holiday weekend, provided perfect conditions for holidays and harvesting: warm, sunny and no rain.

In terms of averages, this total was well below the last ten-year average of 82.6 mm here at Ebford. (However, only 37 mm fell in 2013.)

For students of such matters, the average for August between 2001 and 2010 was 46.4 mm. Annual totals are also increasing nationally and in my local experience. Norman Cann

#### Making Good Use of Your Spare Time



September brings us around, once again, to another seasonal 'tipping point', the autumn equinox. As the evenings start to draw in, and the days slowly shorten,

now is the time to ask an important question: how to make the very best use of our spare time and energy as we switch focus from outdoors to indoors to indoors, from summer sun to autumn leaves?

For members of the Exmouth and District u3a Association, there are a host of handy answers to that key question readily available. Situated at the western end of the spectacular Jurassic World Heritage Coastline, beautiful coastal communities such as Exmouth Town, Budleigh Salterton, Topsham, and the surrounding villages, are home to a host of vibrant, successful, locally run, interest groups serving the leisure time and social needs of the local population. Here, right in the heartland of the East Devon community is a local, low-cost, social, friendly organisation that helps people who are retired, semi-retired, or no longer in full-time work, to make the very best use of their precious spare time and energy. The u3a offers all kinds of activity groups for all kinds of interests and passions. Whether your fancy is for something indoors or outdoors, cerebral or unashamedly active, there is an appropriate interest group here for you.

Founded in 1982 (and originally called the University of the Third Age), the u3a is a nationwide organisation with one strategic vision or purpose - to encourage the creation and operation of independent, locally run, 'mutual aid' bodies that will

- support and facilitate life-long learning;
- help individuals stay active for longer;
- create opportunities for people to have fun whilst doing so.

Learn, Laugh, and Live is the u3a 'mission' and that is exactly what it delivers.

Clearly, the u3a movement, currently managed by The Third Age Trust, is getting something right. Across the UK there are around 1000 local u3a bodies, with over 450,000 members, delivering a wide range of high-quality leisure, recreational, and educational programmes. In Exmouth and Budleigh Salterton, for example, the Exmouth and District u3a has 850 members, about 100 operational interest groups, and yes, the list does actually start at A (art appreciation) and end with Z (Zoom short films). Meetings are held wherever appropriate, eg sport centres, halls, or people's own homes. Members draw on their individual knowledge and skills to teach and learn from each other. This is a volunteer movement that operates from the grass roots, meeting, organising, making things happen.

At the Budleigh Salterton Bowls Club, for example, a new u3a Bowls Group was formed this summer and currently has around 20 new members. Some have now joined the Club as full members, so this is clearly a win-win situation for the Bowls Club, the u3a, and the community.


Here's an overview of the Love Topsham Christmas festivities, starting on 26th November with the annual Christmas Lights Switch On. This will be the perfect start to your festive period,
